Dear Chairman Fisher,

Wildfires are devastating Oregon and California this summer, and we are writing to request that the National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) resume publishing updated firefighting training materials in Spanish. The intensity and scope of the 2018 fire season is unprecedented; as of today, 841 fires in Oregon have burned over 430,000 acres¹, and in California 5,398 fires have scorched over 1.42 million acres². These fast-moving wildfires have caused deaths, burned hundreds of structures, displaced thousands of residents, and cost more than one billion dollars to contain.

Many of these fires burn in terrain too steep and too dangerous for fire engines to reach, and wildland fire crews hike in to wage a front-line battle against the fires. Given that a significant number of these brave wildland fire crews speak Spanish as their native language, it would be wiser and safer to provide bilingual training materials. The alternative is to risk danger and harm by requiring that all firefighters rapidly attempt to understand training materials that are only available in English.

We understand that as of last year, the NWCG no longer publishes current firefighting training materials in Spanish and has never produced bilingual versions of key manuals like the Incident Response Pocket Guide. We urge you to publish updated versions of the following training materials in English and Spanish:

- Incident Response Pocket Guide
- Pocket Safety Card: 10 Standard Firefighting Orders and 18 Watchout Situations
- S-130, Firefighting Training
